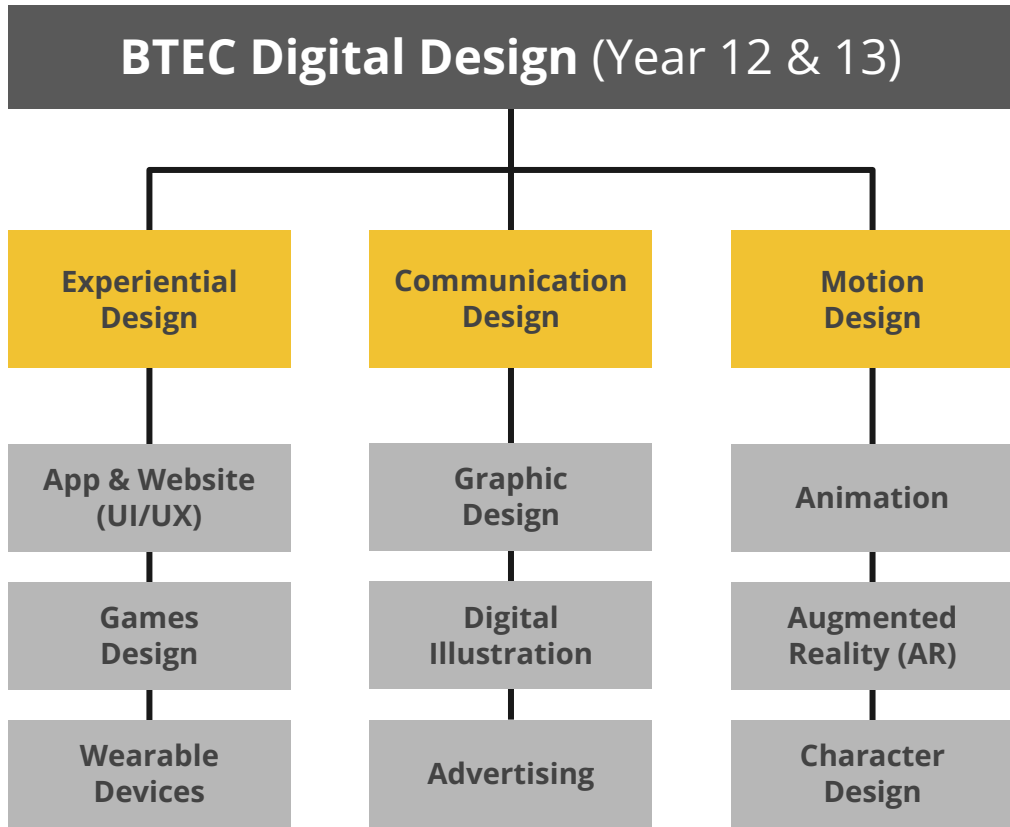

Course Overview

What is a BTEC?

- **British qualification (*just like GCSE*)**
- **BTEC = Business and Technology Education Council**
- **Multiple levels, including BTEC Level 2 (*studied at WIS in Year 10 & 11*) and BTEC Level 3 (*studied at WIS in Year 12 & 13*)**
- **More focused on practical application and industry standard skills than alternative, traditional qualifications such as IB subjects or A-Levels**
- **100 % coursework, with all units internally assessed and quality control checked by a UK based moderator**
- **Recognised pathway to further education or employment**
- **Many universities worldwide accept BTEC qualifications for entry into degree programs**
- **Employers often value the practical skills and industry-specific knowledge that BTEC graduates possess, especially in the creative industries**

Pathways at WIS

Option 1: ID Pathway

Includes:

- Other BTEC Course (Diploma)
- BTEC Digital Design (*Sub-Diploma*)
- One HL IB Subject
- One SL IB Subject

Qualification:

BTEC International Sub-Diploma in Creative Media
(Equivalent to 1 HL IB subject or 1 A-Level subject)

Minor Units:

- 1 | A1 Skills Development (50%)
- 2 | A2 Responding to a Brief (50%)

Example:

BTEC Business (Diploma) + BTEC Digital Design (Sub-Diploma) + IB Visual Art (HL) + IB Biology (SL)

Option 2: ID Pathway

Year 12

A1 Skills Development

In this unit, students complete a wide range of teacher-led design briefs, covering a variety of disciplines such as Graphic Design, Illustration, Animation, UI/UX Design, Advertising, Digital Marketing, Character and Games Design. Students also complete an 'open-choice' project, writing their own design brief and working in their chosen discipline.

B1 Personal Progression

In this unit, students research several career pathways and further education (University) programmes of study. They set personalised goals towards achieving one specific career pathway. Students also produce a range of personal promotion outcomes such as a brand identity, illustrated CV, online portfolio and personal statement in preparation for their University application interviews.

Year 13

A2 Responding to a Brief

In this unit, students respond to a design brief written by Pearson (BTEC examination board). The brief is open in terms of specialist outcome, therefore students can respond in a medium of their choice, focusing on their primary discipline. This evidence is included in their University portfolio.

B3 Creative Industry Response

In this unit, students work with a real, HK based client to produce a response to a client set design brief. Students follow the usual stages of the design cycle, including pitching their response to the client and acting on continued feedback. This unit aims to prepare students for a career in industry and the skills required to work on real projects.

BTEC Unit Assessment

In each unit, students are graded against 5 criteria. Each criteria is awarded a Pass, Merit or Distinction.

1

Informing Ideas

Primary & secondary research, gathered to inform each stage of the design process.

2

Problem Solving

Ability to generate original ideas, problem solve, test & experiment in response to a brief.

3

Technical Skill

Skillful application of software, materials, techniques and processes to produce a creative solution.

4

Professional Practice

Ability to meet interim deadlines & demonstrate professional behaviour to manage the project.

5

Communication

Ability to communicate visually & verbally with the target audience, clients, peers and teachers.

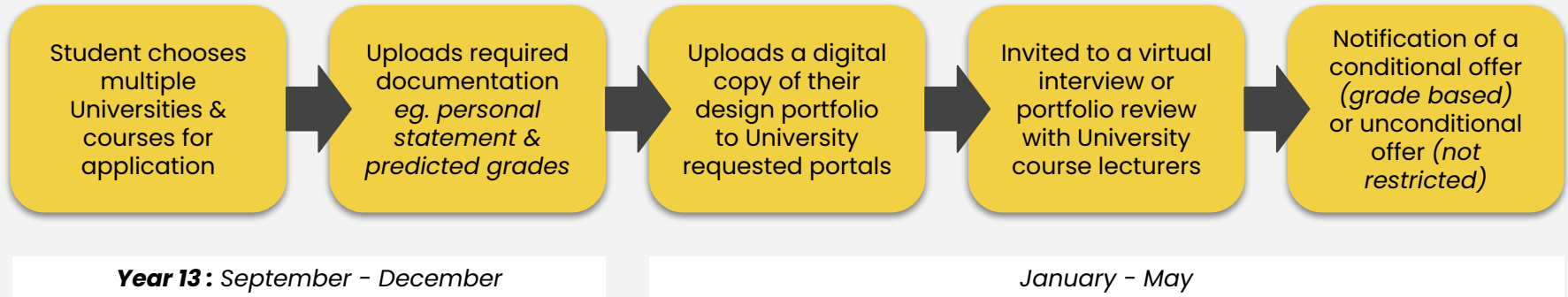

Total UCAS Points = 208

(UK creative degree average is between 80-128 points)

Students who expect to apply out of UK (Europe, US, Canada & Australia etc.) should consider studying IB English & IB Visual Arts on the ID/IBCP pathway to strengthen their application. However, every application is a case-by-case basis.

Standard Application Progress



Students studying a Level 3 BTEC International Diploma in Digital Design are supported by teaching staff for the duration of this process.

Students completing the major unit B1: Personal Progression prepare the majority of this evidence as part of their coursework.

Portfolio Evidence

The common requirement for creative courses at Universities worldwide is a portfolio of past and present design work. This is the primary component of the application progress.

- **Examples of work created in a range of media and mediums, both digital and traditional.**
- **Problem-solving skills, ideation processes and your passion for Design.**
- **Ability to research and translate your thoughts to a finished idea.**
- **Used as a point of discussion during the portfolio review/interview**
- **Method of visually communicating skills and particular interests.**
- **Universities look for potential - not the finished article.**
